

# Medical Consultation and Direction for ACP's Performing MFI

In September 2018 the Saskatchewan College of Paramedics removed the requirement for Medical Control from the Medicated Facilitated Intubation Protocol and created the Physician/Medical Consultation policy to support and encourage consultation.

The Saskatchewan Health Authority in conjunction with the STARS Link Centre has created a process to give Advanced Care Paramedics an option to contact a Transport Physician for consultation or to receive Medical Direction (If required by your ambulance service for MFI).

Consultation can be accessed whether or not air transport services are responding to scene.

Some advantages to consultation in MFI include; discussing medication options, ventilation strategies, and predicting challenges that may arise with a patient during MFI.
