



Section 15(2) ETC (current Language): Saskatchewan College of Paramedics Regulatory Bylaws

4. Licences

- 1. A member may be issued a full licence to practice as an EMR, EMT, EMT-A, EMT-P, or EMT-C upon proof of:
 - a. completion of the application forms required by council;
 - b. payment of the fees set by the college;
 - c. for new members, meeting the requirements for registration in section 2;
 - d. for existing members,
 - i. meeting the continuing medical education requirements in section 7;
 - ii. filing a report satisfactory to council regarding any criminal convictions and any outstanding criminal charges since initial registration or the issuance of the previous licence;
 - iii. filing a report satisfactory to council regarding whether a licence has been cancelled, suspended, restricted or subject to individual terms and conditions by a regulatory authority or health profession in any jurisdiction since initial registration or the issuance of the previous licence. [amended Nov.19, 2010]


