This part-time role involves contributing to multiple committees, providing subject matter expertise, and supporting the development and maintenance of standards, education, and professional conduct within the paramedic profession.

Key Responsibilities

Education Committee

- Support development and review of program standards (EMR – CPP)
- Participate in program approvals, including:
 - EMR programs
 - Non-accredited PCP and ACP programs
- Review and approve continuing education credits and requirements
- Contribute to education requirements related to scope of practice changes

Paramedic Practice Committee

- Assist with protocol updates and standards of practice
- Support development and revision of competency frameworks
- Provide input on scope of practice changes
- Contribute to umbrella legislation discussions, including restricted activities
- Assist with endorsement development, review, and ongoing maintenance (e.g., Community Paramedic, Wound Closure, others)

Professional Conduct Committee

- Provide clinical expertise and regulatory guidance to the manager, committee, and investigators
- Support processes related to:
 - *The Paramedics Act*
 - College Bylaws
 - Professional conduct investigations
- Liaise with members and interested parties on the negotiation of consensual agreements
- Assist with monitoring of consensual agreements



- Draft documents and support referrals to the Discipline Committee
